The Aramex Dubai to Muscat offshore race is the longest running major keelboat event in the region. The 30th edition of this historic event is set to take place in 2023.

In 2011, Oman Sail began planning to make sailing accessible to the Omani public with discussions into the possibility of starting a para sailing programme.

This dream became a reality & SailFree was officially launched on the United Nations, International Day of Persons with Disabilities, 3rd December 2019.

SailFree is a sailing & leadership programme created for people aged 16-30 years old with disabilities (especially with physical impairment) to empower Omani disabled youth & create equal opportunities in the sport of sailing.

Achieved in 2 years and during a pandemic.

Delivered in 3 phases, across 2 World Sailing accredited Oman Sail Sailing Schools, located in Mussanah & Muscat.

Using the multi-functional RS Venture Connect dinghy which can be quickly configured to suit the needs of each person with their own unique disability.

Omani instructors have taught theory & practical techniques.

WAS DELIVERED FOR THE FIRST TIME IN OMAN:

Para sailors, coaches & therapists came together to further enhance their para sailing knowledge on and off the water.

- 4 Omani therapists from Al Amal are in the process of aligning their existing disability classification criteria, with the International Proficiency Certificate classification for international events.
- International Classifier final assessment scheduled in November 2022.
- Currently, there are only **11** International Classifiers worldwide.
- To gain 4 new Classifiers as a result of SailFree, would be a major step forward for para sailing in the Middle East & globally.

RS Venture Connect World Championships, Mussanah, Oman (20 -27 November)

Resulting from the success of SailFree, Oman Sail won the bid to host the 1st para sailing Championship to be held in Asia.

36 Teams:

- 5 Teams sponsored by World Sailing (Portugal, Poland, Czechia, Estonia, Philippines)
- 2021 event in Germany for comparison had 12 Teams




