Steering the Course 2025 #AccelerateAction

Join World Sailing in celebrating the 5th Edition of Steering the Course by celebrating the actions taken towards achieving gender equity in our sport.

After the release of Steering the Course, World Sailing's plan to support women in Sailing in 2024, we are now looking to celebrate the actions achieved and the key milestones reached by everyone around the World, joining the International Women's Day theme of #AccelerateAction.

World Sailing will feature a number of key actions and projects that have arisen out of Steering the Course and are encouraging Sailing Clubs, Centres, Member National Authorities, Class Associations, and volunteers to not only celebrate successes, but also sign up to support the event and then to take part in any one of activities suggested.

What can I do to take part in 2025?

We are encouraging Sailing Clubs, Centres, Member National Authorities, Class Associations and volunteers to sign up to host activities as part of the two key festival times.

To date, 56 countries have participated in or ran activities as part of Steering the Course, and we would love to keep that number growing.

Activities suggestions can be found later on in the booklet, but as part of 2025 we are also encouraging those who take part to celebrate the actions their club, MNA or Class Association has taken to accelerate towards gender equity. This could be through creating more opportunities for women to train as Race Officials, creating new activities in a program to bring in new women members or just by making a more inclusive club.

When will Steering the Course run?

2025 will see two festivals take place. Events can be run in whichever festival suits your calendar best, even both festivals if you like!



Festival 1 - Friday 23 May – Sunday 1 June 2025

Festival 2 - Friday 26 September–Sunday 5 October 2025

Participants can also choose the best days to suit them, whether it is a weekend or the whole 10 days. If you cannot complete an activity within the chosen dates, do not be put off, the most important part is participation and accelerating action.

World Sailing is also aware that this important action should be a focus of our attention all year round, so we will be working on a year-round communications campaign to increase awareness. We encourage any participants to take part in this initiative too.



What activities can we run as part of Steering the Course?

We have a range of activity suggestions available but are also encouraging participants to suggest other ideas too.

Any activity that promotes Sailing as a sport or recreational activity to new participants, or invites existing participants to try new roles, is welcome. Clubs and Centres can also incorporate more than one activity.

Suggested activities include:

Taster Sessions – fun sessions to get new participants involved in the sport, think across all disciplines in the sport too, to cover Dinghy, Keel, Windsurf and Kite. World Sailing will provide example session plans for different age groups to include games.

Learn To sail Courses for girls and women.

Women's Race Day/Event – women only race day/event.

Race Day with female race officials – where possible use a group of all female race officials or invite new interested females to shadow current race officials. This can be implemented alongside a Women's Race Day.

Women at the Helm – can be used as both a training or racing exercise. Women must be helm in all training exercises or for racing for all races.

Be an Instructor or Coach for the day – current female youth sailors work with instructors or coaches for the day (possibly even delivering the taster sessions) to see what its like to be coach. This then offers the opportunity to sign post them to future MNA coaching and instructor courses.

Bring a friend along – encourage active participations to bring a friend or family member along to try out the sport they love.

Information sessions – 20-minute information sessions on volunteering opportunities including shore based regatta assistants, race officials etc.

As well as a range of social activities:

Inspirational Talks or Questions and Answer Sessions – get a local sailing star to answer questions and inspire the next generation

eSailing Challenges – challenge club members to an eSailing event. This is great if the weather is not in your favour.

Open Days – think BBQ, Quiz night, wine tasting – any event to show the community side of the sport.
